INTRODUCTION OF AL ENDERLE

Al was born in Santa Ana. He attended Tustin schools, graduating from Tustin High. From there he went to Stanford where he majored in Mechanical Engineering. Al left Stanford to enter the United States Naval Academy at Annapolis where he majored in Electrical Engineering and graduated with degree and the rank of 2nd Lt. in the United States Air Force. Al did graduate work in Business Management and Guided Missiles.

Upon leaving active military duty Al became a citrus rancher in Orange County and a member of the City of Tustin Planning Commission. In addition Al has been a yacht dealer and yacht broker, has owned and operated a number of apartment and industrial complexes and was the Editor at Large and technical writer for Popular Rotorcraft Magazine.

During the late sixties and early seventies Al became a professional adventurer on the order of John Goddard and Richard Haliburton. As the result of his adventures he was asked to join the exclusive Adventurers Club of Los Angeles. He has appeared on national television and articles have been written about his adventures.

During the seventies Al headed up the design and development of Enderle Center which he currently owns and operates. Enderle Center has received acclaim as being the finest shopping center of its kind in Orange County.
